 - a. Why does Paul describe himself as a debtor to all people?
 - b. What might it mean for us to see ourselves as indebted to share the gospel?
- 5. "I am not ashamed..." (vv.16–17)
 - a. Why might people be ashamed of the gospel?
 - b. What makes the gospel "the power of God for salvation"?
 - c. How do we live unashamedly in a culture that often resists faith?
