Easter Means Recognising who is King


There will be a great deal of Jubilee celebrations in the coming months and rightly so. But as the Queen has consistently stressed, there is a higher monarch than any earthly ruler. And Easter is the high point of our remembrance of that fact.

Jesus had walked all the way from Galilee to Jerusalem. But he rode into Jerusalem. He did this not because he was tired, but because he was signalling who he was. Whilst it is rightly pointed out that riding on a donkey was a sign of humility, key Old Testament kings like David and Solomon entered Jerusalem that way. And other kings were welcomed with cloaks and palms strewn on the road.

Palm Sunday was Jesus signalling he came as King. He came gently, but he came as King. He came to grief on Good Friday, but his resurrection declared his coming in power.

Easter Means we can Let Go of COVID Bitterness

A great deal has gone wrong. A great deal of life has happened, but in a 'low-fat' fashion. The last few years feel like a succession of crises of one sort or another. And this has often corroded our souls.



We easily become snarky, ever able to see the sawdust in the other person's eye.

At the heart of the Christian faith is the cross of Christ, God reaching out to us in Jesus. Here is amazing grace. And, boy, do we need it. As we approach Good Friday, this is a moment to ask God for his grace – that we might transmit that grace - grace to forgive others, grace to ask for forgiveness from others.

The church leader Rick Warren speaks of a brilliant prayer, called 'EGR'. EGR stands for 'Extra Grace Required, Lord!' It is a prayer I find myself endlessly saying.

Looking back over COVID, I know St Barnabas has had to make all kinds of decisions. You may agree with some and not others. I certainly have got things wrong at times. And as you look back, is there someone you or I need to apologise to? Easter is a good time to do that.

Easter Day means Living in Hope

Good Friday is not where things end. Jesus rose from the dead on Easter Day so we live in hope, not fear. From COVID to Ukraine to economic woes, recent years have felt a succession of shocks. But Christians do not need to be flattened by these sad events.

There are good things happening in our church. Thank God we were able to hold our 'Taste & See' mission weekend with 'Ace' a few weeks ago. Thank God for the connections deepening we have with local schools and



students. Thank God for growth in our work with children both on Sundays and midweek. Thank God for the way we are expanding our by offering again activities communion to those who are housebound. Thank God for the Community Grocery - it is not yet ready, but we are close now.

All of the above was not happening, or only happening to a much smaller degree, twelve months ago.

Reconnecting with God this Easter

I warmly encourage you to reconnect with the God of resurrection this Easter - whether you come to church or church comes to you.

The resurrection of Jesus is the heart of the Christian faith. We have had so many troubles in recent years that we need continually reminding of that fact. And, if we trust in a God who raises the dead, our lives and our work will never be in vain.
